“Go forth into the world  
to serve God with gladness;  
be of good courage;  
hold fast to that which is good;  
render to no one evil for evil;  
strengthen the fainthearted;  
support the weak;  
help the afflicted;  
honor all people;  
love and serve God,  
rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit.”

Whatever the times, this is a good way to live. This is what the Lord requires of us. This prayer is worth memorizing and living. Can you do this?

### **Transfiguration of our Lord—March 1-2:**

We'll celebrate Transfiguration as a Youth Sunday, with our children and youth helping to lead worship on March 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Faith Lutheran Youth (FLY) Choir will sing at the 10:15 service. If you (or your child) would like to be involved in the service, please contact Pastor Jean.

**Ash Wednesday Liturgies with Holy Communion and the Imposition of Ashes—March 5, 12:00 noon and 6:00 p.m.** (Note the earlier times). Lent begins with a reminder of our mortality along with a call to repentance and renewal. We are dust, but we are dust marked with the sign of the life-giving cross. "Return to the Lord. For God is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love".

**First Sunday in Lent, March 9**—Rabbi S. Robert Morais from Temple Anshe Hesed will be our guest preacher at the 10:15 service.

### **Midweek Evening Vespers**

**Wednesdays of Lent, March 12-April 9, at 6:00 p.m.** (Note the earlier time).

Join us for weekly evening prayer this Lent. We'll be using the beautiful sung liturgy for Vespers from the ELW, and Pastor Jean will offer a series of reflections on the book of Job.

## **Holy Week Worship**



**Palm Sunday—April 13, 10:00 a.m.—Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord! We will celebrate Palm Sunday with one combined service for the weekend.** (No Saturday service on April 12<sup>th</sup>). Worship will include a Procession with Palms, a joyful retelling of the

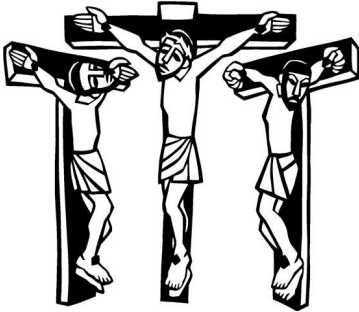
Palm Sunday gospel, and a dramatic reading of the Passion of our Lord according to St. Luke. *A signup sheet for readers for the Passion will be available in the narthex in late March.*



**Maundy Thursday—April 17, 6:00 p.m. (Note earlier time). Service of Holy Communion with Rite of Foot (or Hand) Washing & Stripping of the Altar**

This night begins the Triduum, the Three Great Days at the center of our liturgical year and at the core of our faith. The word "Maundy" refers to the new commandment Christ has given us, to love one another as he has loved us. In the gospel reading for this day, Christ shows that love by washing the feet of his friends, and commands us to do likewise. Our worship will include the opportunity to follow that command by participating in the rite of foot washing. (We will also have a station for hand washing, for those who prefer not to kneel). The service will conclude with stripping the altar (symbolizing Christ's betrayal and abandonment) and a reading of Psalm 22, which begins "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

**Holy Week Services (continued):**



**Good Friday—April 18: Prayer at the Cross--12 noon and Tenebrae—6:00 p.m.** (Note earlier time for the evening service). We call this Friday “good” because Jesus’ death on the cross has brought life and salvation to the world. “We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you, for by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.” **This year we will observe Good Friday with Prayer at the Cross at 12 noon and a Tenebrae Service at 6:00.** The **Prayer at the Cross** service will be a spoken liturgy with scripture readings and prayers that focus on the life-giving mystery of the Cross, along with harp arrangements of traditional hymns. The **Tenebrae Service** will feature a reading of the Passion according to St. John, punctuated by musical reflections, prayers, and extinguishing of candles. The service will end with a dramatic procession and meditation on the cross.

**Easter Vigil—Saturday, April 19, 8:00 p.m.**

We gather on this holy night to celebrate the great mystery of the Resurrection of our Lord. The Vigil service begins outdoors, with the lighting of the paschal fire, then moves into the darkened sanctuary with the ancient Easter hymn known as the Exsultet. The liturgy continues with a service of several readings that proclaim the great events of salvation history, followed by a service of Holy Baptism or an affirmation of baptism. Then the lights are lit, the chancel is decorated, and we celebrate the first Holy Communion of Easter. Alleluia! Christ is risen!

*We will need readers and acolytes for this service, as well as volunteers to participate in the pick-up sound effects orchestra, Nebuchadnezzar’s Lonely Hearts Club Band. Speak with Pastor Jean if you can help. Thanks!*



**Easter Sunday—April 20, 8:00 and 10:15 a.m.**

With joy and wonder, we celebrate that Christ is risen indeed. Alleluia! We are forgiven and free. Death does not get the last word. Life wins. Love wins. Alleluia!

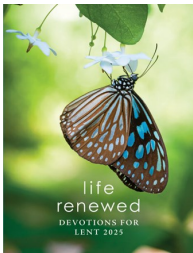


## New Organ Fund

As you have probably read in the annual report, our current Rodgers organ is 25 years old and is approaching the end of its projected lifecycle. We anticipate needing to purchase a new organ in the next 5-8 years. Our Director of Music, Brian Gray, has begun researching our options. The replacement value (with installation) of our current instrument would be around \$150,000. However, there are other promising options that could be purchased and installed for around \$20,000-\$50,000. We are forming an Organ Task Force to develop a recommendation and to plan fundraising efforts. (If you are interested in serving on this task force, please reach out to Brian). Last December, Bishop Lozano and three other representatives from our synod spent a week in our companion diocese, the Karagwe Diocese of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania. They met with Bishop Bagonza and his staff, visited church schools and congregations. The Lutheran Church in Tanzania is Spirit-filled and growing rapidly. In recent months, ten new congregations were established! These buildings need roofs. The cost per sheet of roofing material is \$10 per sheet. The average building needs 500 sheets. Our special offering on March 15-16 will go towards the purchase of sheet metal for these new church roofs. Thank you for your support!

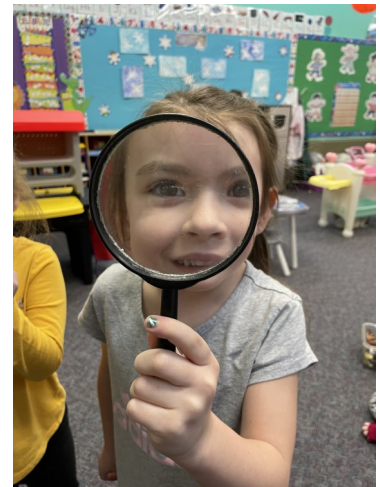

### From the Console

With the end of winter approaching, so does the end of this season of “Green” in the sanctuary. With Easter being on April 20 th this year, Ash Wednesday falls in March instead of the usual February. Our beautiful purple appointments come out of hiding, and the nave becomes almost cozy (for lack of a better description).



Lent is a wonderful time of reflection and repentance leading to Easter. Since I was a young boy, Holy Week has undoubtedly been my favorite week of the church year. The beauty of our liturgies and traditions reach deep into my heart, and I feel a deeper strengthening of my faith as we approach Easter and the Resurrection. During the triduum (the Three Days), we reflect so deeply on what our Savior did for us, and feel as though we’ve almost been placed in the tomb with him, and culminate on Easter with the chancel becoming “alive” with the Easter Garden and White paraments.

A fun fact for your week. When we reference Sundays in the liturgical calendar, it is “Sundays OF Epiphany (or Christmas...or Pentecost...etc)”. The exception to this is Lent. Sundays do not count towards the 40 days. They are referenced as “Sundays IN Lent”. This was always explained to me that every Sunday is a “miniature” Easter, where we celebrate and remember the Resurrection.
