

Pastor's Page

Where do you find hope?

Almost two thousand years ago, St. Paul wrote this to the church in Corinth: "We proclaim Christ crucified...for God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength" (1 Cor. 1:23-25). Some of the Christians in



Over five hundred years ago, a young Martin Luther argued in his "Heidelberg Disputation" against theologians who wanted to bypass Good Friday. These "theologians of glory" called evil good and good evil. They wanted to justify themselves; they were lacking in empathy and humility. Luther was a good student of St. Paul. He understood that being honest about our sinfulness does not lead to despair, but to hope, as we realize our need for grace. That need leads us to the foot of the cross. It is there, hidden in suffering and weakness, that the true glory and power of God are revealed: 'Now it is not sufficient for anyone, and it does him no good to recognize God in his glory and majesty, unless he recognizes him in the humility and shame of the cross...For this reason, true theology and recognition of God are in the crucified Christ".

The false theology of glory is still alive and well today. Examples of hubris abound. Deceptive worldly promises of security, wealth, control, and power over others still tempt us. In contrast, we are called to turn to God, who is revealed most clearly in suffering and weakness. We see the crucified One in those who are despised and rejected, those who are treated unjustly, those who are most vulnerable.

Turn to Christ, and him crucified. There is our hope. In closing, I want to share a beautiful and profound hymn text from the third century. Since a friend shared it recently with me, I have been meditating on these words, and invite you to do the same:

"This cross is the tree in which I take delight. I take root in its roots; I am extended in its branches. In my tent I am shaded by its shade; its flowers are my flowers; I am wholly delighted by its fruits. This cross is my nourishment when I am hungry, my fountain when I am thirsty, my covering when I am stripped. For my leaves are no longer fig leaves, but the breath of life This cross is the ladder of Jacob, the way of blessed angels. This cross is my tree, wide as the firmament, extending from earth to the heavens. This cross is the Tree of Life."

New Organ Fund

As you may have read in our 2024 annual report, our current Rodgers organ is 25 years old and is approaching the end of its projected lifecycle. We anticipate needing to purchase a new organ in the next 5-8 years. Our Director of Music, Brian Gray, has begun researching our options. The replacement value (with installation) of our current instrument would be around \$150,000. However, there are other promising options that could be purchased and installed for around \$20,000-\$50,000. We have formed an Organ Task Force to develop a recommendation and to plan fundraising efforts. (If you are interested in serving on this task force, please reach out to Brian). 

Hurray for Spring! The children of Faith Lutheran Preschool have been busy as bees, learning new things and reviewing past lessons. We are preparing for promotion (Preschool) and graduation (Pre-K) in May.

We learned about Police and Doctors during the month of March, ending with a visit from WQLN on Community Helpers! In addition, the PreK started reading! We learned about vowels & now know a dozen 'sight' words. Our spring crafts included many rainbows (some with pots of gold!), piglets & other baby animals, and pretty painted kites. Our Preschool class worked with the colors of the rainbow & baby animals, too—our vocabulary grew with new words like lamb, chick, duckling & colt. These students worked hard & can now write their own names. We enjoyed many shamrock activities to help celebrate St. Patrick's Day. We want to be sure to thank ALL in our community who helped to donate/purchase school items from our Angel Board—we love you!

April found our students digging into all things Spring: rain, clouds, flowers, eggs, insects & ponds. The PreK class was very excited to have Mr. Brian Gray teach us Bus Safety and take us to all 3 Harborcreek schared stories & songs with both classes to halp us learn more about Jesus Palm Sunday, and Easter. The

The children studied the parts of a plant and what plants need to be able to grow. We were amazed to learn there are so many kinds of flowers and so many types of insects.

Our PreK children have become amazing at reading; they are blending sounds to read CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) words. Plus, the students can write sentences with words they know & can add/subtract using 1-10 objects to help! The Preschool class has reviewed the whole alphabet and is now working to learn the sounds for each letter. We know colors, numbers 0-10, and shapes; a favorite activity is creating patterns. Though our Easter week was short, there were eggs for everyone & even some jellybeans!

BOOK CLUB Book Club Books for May-December 2025

The Faith book club meets on the second Tuesday of the month at 5:30 p.m. All are welcome! Here are the books for the rest of the year:

MAY: "The Briar Club" by Kate Quinn. The haunting and powerful story of a female friendships and secrets in a Washington, D.C. boarding house during the McCarthy Era.

JUNE: "The Secrets We Keep" by Kate Hewitt. A gripping, emotional, suspenseful story about two very different women and the summer that they share.

JULY: "The Swimmers" by Julie Otsuka is a novel about a group of regular swimmers whose lives are disrupted when a crack appears at the bottom of the pool. The story explores themes of routine, loss, memory, and the impact of dementia on individuals and families. NPR recommended.

AUGUST: "James" by Percival Everett is a retelling of Mark Twain's "The Adventures by Huckleberry Finn" from the perspective of Jim, an enslaved Black man whose escape parallels and overlaps with young Huck's journey. NYT Bestseller

SEPTEMBER: "Broken Country" by Leslie Clarke is an unforgettable story of love, loss and the choices that shape our lives ..but is also a crafted mystery that will keep you guessing until the end. Reese's book club pick.

OCTOBER: "The Sunflower House" by Adriana Allegri tells the poignant story of Allina, a young woman in the late 1930's Germany who is forced into a Nazi -run Lebensborn home designed to breed the "perfect generation."

NOVEMBER: "Predator", by best selling author Terri Blackstock, is about the murder of Krista Carmichael's 14 year old sister and how this makes her question God's justice and protection. Desperate to find the killer, she creates her own online persona.

DECEMBER: "The 13th Gift: A True Story of a Christmas Miracle" by Joanne Huist Smith. The true story about how the power of random acts of kindness transforms one of the bleakest moments in a family history into a time of strength and love.
